Opposition to a Balanced Budget Amendment (BBA)

- 1. The Feds can always balance the budget by raising taxes, rather than cutting spending. Which do you think they'll do?!
- 2. Our Constitution didn't provide for a balanced federal budget, because Congress is granted only few and defined <u>enumerated powers</u>. If the feds wouldn't spend money unconstitutionally, they'd be able to balance the budget easily and have a surplus. We need to downsize our federal government to its constitutional powers.
- 3. Most BBA proposals have the same escape clause: balancing the budget is required only in the absence of a national emergency. The US has been in a continual state of multiple national emergencies since 1979. If a BBA had passed 4 decades ago, Congress still wouldn't be required to balance its budget! Voting for the BBA does nothing except risk our Constitution
