Choose one or write your own:

1. Delegates have more power than State Legislatures and are not subject to state law—including the restrictions in state applications.
2. Opening up our Constitution in such a politically contentious atmosphere is a horrible idea.
3. The only control State Legislatures have over the Article V Convention process is to ask Congress to call a convention. After that, it's out of your hands.
4. The Convention Lobby is bankrolled by dark money from those who can't wait to get their hands on our Constitution.
5. Ratification by 3/4 of the states is not a safeguard against a runaway convention. Delegates to the Convention can change the ratification process and make it easier like they did when they set a precedent in 1787.
6. Congress has never called a convention under Article V. No one knows what will happen!
7. The popularity of a balanced budget and term limits amendments, as measured by polls and petitions, tell us **nothing** about public opinion on an Article V Convention. Such measurements are misleading and irrelevant. Most people have no idea what an Article V Convention or “convention of states” is.
8. The Constitution isn't the problem!
9. There is no such thing as a limited convention!
