<p>***New applications passed to replace sunseting (expiring) applications. Sunset clauses are used by the CON Lobby to make deals they'll break, when they don't have the votes to pass the application otherwise. Their plan is to present the identical legislation as a "tweak"—without the sunset clause—as soon as possible after passage. The new application usually passes without scrutiny and continues indefinitely. Oklahoma replaced their 2016 Oklahoma BBA/COS applications that would have expired in 7-1/2 years, almost 3 years early; COS replaced their 2017 Missouri application that would have expired in 5 years, 1 year early; USTL replaced their 2018 Missouri application that would have expired in 5 years, 1 year early; Nebraska's 2022 COS application passed on 1/28/2022 and expires in 5 years. COS has been trying to replace it in every session since, beginning only 11 months after its passage! The 2017 Texas COS application didn't include a sunset, but the deal COS made to get it passed in 2017 included a clause in a separate bill that would cause the COS application <i>and all future applications</i> to expire 8 years after passage. COS attempted & failed to rescind the 8-year expiration date in a separate bill in both 2023 & 2025. They also failed in 2023 to extend the expiration date to 16 years! COS finally (and barely) passed its original Texas COS application again on May 8, 2025. The 2017 application automatically rescinded on May 10, 2025; the 2025 application will automatically rescind on May 8, 2033. Georgia's BBA application expired after almost 6 years on Jan 1, 2020, because the BBA Lobby forgot about it. With public scrutiny, as opposed to a tweak, they still haven't been able to pass it. Meanwhile, the CON Lobby simply ignores its expiration and counts Georgia for having an active BBA application anyway—using its COS application instead. Few notice.</p>
