*Since 2,000, there were 2.5 times more states that rescinded all applications on record, than new states (i.e., without applications) that passed an application.

** In the past **decade**, there were 3.25 times more states that rescinded all applications on record, than new states (i.e., without applications) that passed an application.

NOTE: The following 17 States have no applications on record as of 1-6-2026 (year of rescission in parens): Hawaii (which has never passed an application under Article V); and the states which rescinded all their applications without passing new ones: Idaho (2000), Virginia (2004), Montana (2007), Delaware (2016), Maryland (2017), New Mexico (2017), Nevada (2017), Colorado (2021), New Jersey (2021), Illinois (2022), Oregon (2023), New York (2024), Washington State (Apr., 2025), Connecticut (May, 2025), California (Sept., 2025), and Massachusetts (Nov., 2025).
